Hello All:

Here is quick update on your radio station:

- The new studio furniture arrived late last week and the mic arms and microphones today. Chuck Lakaytis, the Alaska Public Broadcasting engineer who has been here before is arriving in Sand Point tomorrow afternoon. Chuck will install the new equipment. The production studio upgrade is part of the station's Round V Capital Grant award.
- State Representative Bryce Edgmon and State Senator Lyman Hoffman successfully included capital grant money for the radio station in the FY 2011 Alaska Capital Budget. \$50,000.00 is the amount. While the number could change, Governor Parnell and his staff are carefully reviewing the capital budget, the outlook for us is good, according to Edgmon's office last week. The special grant will fund 1.) Refurbishment of the FM translator in King Cove, and 2.) Replacement of the ground system at the station's AM transmitter site.
- Public radio station KDLG in Dillingham and KSDP have what appears is a final agreement to transfer the King Cove translator license to us. The first agreement prepared by Larry Miller, which the Board approved at its last meeting, met with disapproval in Dillingham. The revised agreement from Miller should clear the way for a timely transfer allowing work in King Cove to proceed this summer.
