
Kyle Settles: The Magpie is the only North American bird whose tail makes up more than half of its total body length.



SENIORS, FAFSA DEADLINE IS COMING ON MARCH 2ND

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is available online by starting your account at FAFSA.gov and the applications are due on or before March 2nd. Parents do not need their taxes completed before filing, just an estimate of your yearly income is all you need to file.

THE SOONER, THE BETTER....

To qualify for grants, low interest loans and on campus jobs, you must submit a FAFSA to the school(s) you are thinking about attending. Don't be at the end of the line, get your FAFSA in as soon as possible! You can't get help with financing your college without submitting a FAFSA. This is required everywhere.

THERE IS HELP OUT THERE....

There are many websites available to guide you through this process. I am also available anytime to help you complete the process. **BE SURE TO SAVE YOUR WORK AS YOU GO ALONG!** This will make the process easier in the long run.
