Well this year is off to a great start, and good things are happening at Sand Point School. The kids are getting back into the routine, and the new seventh graders are doing great at making the adjustment into Middle School. This year we will be doing AR reading again, and the first check is Friday; your child should be listed as having 25 percent or higher of their AR goal earned. If they do not, encourage them to be reading. Reading is one of the most important skills a student will need in their lives, and your interest in their learning is the best gift you can give them. In class we are reading either "Touching Spirit Bear," the story of a troubled youth experiencing healing through a years banishment in Southeast Alaska, or "Flowers for Algernon," a classic novel telling the story of a mentally challenged man who has an experimental surgery to become smarter. The kids are liking both books, and this year we will be reading some classic books and stories in class and out. Sand Point also has a publications class, and we will have a newsletter for school and community events, as well as creating a website for the school and, with any luck, a short documentary about Sand Point and how people live here. Look for our first newsletter soon, on the district website! Student Testing scores were good last year, with steady improvement in reading and writing being the trend. The entire 10th Grade class passed both the reading and writing sections of the HSGQE, good job Juniors! That class is having even more fun as we move towards graduation, and is getting the chance to read some really challenging and fun literature this year. If the rest of this year goes as well as the first two weeks, Sand Point School is going to have a great year!
